### From the Desk of the Library Director

Happy New Year from the staff of the Vicksburg District Library!

At the library, we are completing a year of successfully serving the community and preparing for the next when our new fiscal year begins in March.

As of November, 18,530 items have circulated, and we have provided 97 programs, a majority of these appearing online. We estimate that we will circulate more than 24,000 items by the end of February, and we look forward to continuing to serve the Village of Vicksburg during the 2021-2022 year. Currently, we are in the phase of our year when we develop our budget for the coming year and request a portion of our funding from the State of Michigan.

Because of this, we are strongly weighing our options for serving patrons while COVID-19 is prevalent in the United States. The Vicksburg District Library is continuing to plan ways to serve patrons via curbside service appointments and through electronic programming available on social media. During the coming year, we intend to continue to provide online programming, give away craft kits, supply choice book-bundles, and offer other services via curbside appointment. It is our hope that patrons within the community will continue to contact us with questions and comments via our email address and phone. This is a time with the library aspires to continue developing information services for the community.

## Curbside Pickup Service FAQs

#### How do I set up a Curbside Pickup appointment?

Place an item on hold in our catalog, the MeL catalog, or give us a call at the library to place a hold for you. Once your item is physically in hand and ready to be checked out, we will call or email you that your item is ready for pick up and we can make an appointment at that time. At your appointment time, pull in and call us from the parking lot letting us know you have arrived. Give us a few minutes to gather your items and check them out to your account. When we approach your vehicle, please wear a mask and present your card for verification. And you are all set. Take your items home to enjoy!

#### What other services are available curbside at this time?

Make an appointment with us and we can also take care of the following services:

- \* Copying items that are already printed by a patron
- \* Faxing items
- \* Laminating items
- \* Registering and renewing library cards

Please keep in mind that we do not accept debit or credit card. We only take cash or personal check.

#### What services are NOT available at this time?

The following services are strictly  $\underline{\mathsf{NOT}}$  available at this time while we are closed to the public:

- \* Printing from email, downloads, and USB drives
- \* Resizing hard copies and/or photos
- \* Computer usage/checkout

Please note for safety reasons, walk ups without an appointment scheduled will <u>NOT</u> be served. We kindly ask patrons to be prompt with their appointment times. If you are early or late, you may have to wait for us to complete serving other patrons before we can serve you. Thank you for your patience and diligence during this time.
